Return of Borrowed Student Devices – In preparation for the 2021-22 school year, families are asked to [return borrowed devices](#) (e.g. iPad, Chromebook, Internet Hub) to any TDSB school by Friday, July 2 (for elementary schools) and Friday, July 9 (for secondary schools) between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Some families have requested to return borrowed devices before the end of the school year, and we want to accommodate those requests. All students who need to keep the device until the end of the school year can do so.

Selection Form for In-Person or Virtual Learning (2021-22) – The TDSB will be asking families to complete an online Selection Form for In-Person or Virtual Learning in August. At that time, families will have up-to-date information on the status of the pandemic and vaccinations for school staff and students, and will be in a better position to make an informed decision. If you have moved this past year, or plan to move over summer, it is important that you please complete the [Student Transportation Application form](#) with your new address, and email it to your school (or to [studenttransportationapplications@tdsb.on.ca](mailto:studenttransportationapplications@tdsb.on.ca) after schools are closed for the summer) to avoid delays in bussing.
